### Activity Guideline

When retelling the story, students should at least include the following structure:

1) Orientation,

e.g.: There was a poor little girl who sold matches on New Year Eve.

2) Complication,

e.g.: She was afraid to go home because she did not sell the matches. She was very cold on the street and used the matches to warm herself.

3) Resolution

e.g. The next morning, she was found dead due to the cold.

4) Reorientation (optional)

e.g: The tragic story of this little girl has taught us to care about the people around us.

Activity 2: What would you do if you met the little match girl on the street?

Alternative answer:

If I met her that night, I would :

- 1) buy her matches
- 2) give her something (clothes/blankets/gloves/socks) to warm herself
- 3) invite her to celebrate the New Year's Eve with me and my family
